O'Fallon knocks off Mascoutah; Schulte sets Mater Dei scoring record

MASCOUTAH, III. • O'Fallon's reward for beating Mascoutah 51-40 Tuesday in the opening round of the Mascoutah Invitational is a quarterfinal matchup against unbeaten Mater Dei.

Not that Panthers coach Ryan Massey is complaining.

"We haven't come in here in the past and won that first-round game too often, so for us to be in the winner's bracket is a nice accomplishment," said Massey, whose squad improved to 5-2. "We're growing as a team and getting better."

O'Fallon, which will face Mater Dei at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, generally looked sharp in defeating Mascoutah, which dropped to 3-9.

"It wasn't perfect," Massey said. "At halftime, they had scored 14 of their 20 points from the free-throw line and we had communicated earlier about not overplaying defensively. We got the ball in the high post and didn't always do good things with it, but we got it there and tried to execute our game plan."

Mascoutah tied the score at 15 on two free throws by Brittany Zipfel with 4:44 remaining in the second quarter, but a pair of free throws by Taylor Klingelhoefler capped a 12-2 O'Fallon run and put the Panthers on top 27-17 with 1:33 to play. The score was 29-20 at halftime.

A layup by Klingelhoefler extended O'Fallon's lead to 45-30 with 7:35 remaining in the fourth quarter. Mascoutah never got closer than 11 points the rest of the way.

Klingelhoefler and Katie Roustio led the Panthers with 15 points apiece, and Victoria Ham added 13. Jessica Scinto had 11 points for Mascoutah.

In other first-round games:

MATER DEI 83, RIVERVIEW GARDENS 32 • For the Knights (12-0), the outcome was never in doubt. The high point came with 3:09 to play in the first quarter when Brooke Schulte came up with a steal and a layup to set the school's career scoring record. The bucket gave Schulte 1,615 career points. Barb Perkes held the old mark, 1,614 points, since 1986.

"I'm honored to be compared to the leaders in that category," said Schulte, who finished with 22 points. "I didn't really know about (the record) until I read about it in the paper, and I just put it in the back of my mind. When I hit, I didn't know Coach (Dave Kohnen) was going to call a timeout, but it was a great feeling."

"I've really learned to shoot the 3-ball better, and (playing) AAU definitely helped," said Schulte, a DePaul recruit. "I learned to dribble left-handed a lot better. I played my hardest all the way through and never

Emily Koelling led Mater Dei with 24 points. Brianna Whitney (14 points) and Shinett Page (12) were the top scorers for Riverview.

ALTHOSS 44, OKAWVILLE 41 • Althoff had to rally from a 32-29 halftime deficit. The Crusaders were led offensively by Kymber Hill's 16 points and Whitney Harris' 11 points. Hanna Bergkoetter and Megan Wienstroer had 17 and 15 points, respectively, for Okawville.

HIGHLAND 61, FREEBURG 53 (OT) • Highland outscored Freeburg 16-11 in the fourth quarter to send the game into overtime. Highland freshman Olivia LaPorta scored 20 points. Sarah Trobaugh (13 points) and Emily Michael (12) were also in double figures for Highland. Taylor Poindexter had a game-high 21 points for Freeburg.

NASHVILLE 42, CARLYLE 40 • Erica Brown (12 points) and Shawn Rennegarbe (10) led the way for the Hornets (11-0), who led 30-19 after three quarters. Courtney Kern had 11 points and Cati Funderburk 10 for Carlyle.

MOUNT VERNON 60, BELLEVILLE EAST 54 • Jessica Green scored 21 points and Cheyenne Piper added 17 for the Rams, who rallied from a 41-37 third-quarter deficit. Alexis Brown had 22 points for East.

BREESE CENTRAL 57, CARBONDALE 28 • Madison Timmermann had 25 points as Cougars improved to 11-2. Taylor Voss added 12 points for Central, which led 26-10 at halftime.

BELLEVILLE WEST 39, CENTRALIA 38 • The Maroons (6-6) had a nine-point fourth-quarter lead but had to keep Centralia from scoring on its final possession to preserve the victory.

A layup by Ashton Doza brought Centralia within one point with 12 seconds to play, but the Annies couldn't get a shot off before the buzzer.

West was two for 11 from the free-throw line and turned the ball over on three of its last five possessions.

"We didn't give the ball away by throwing it away -- we just didn't execute offensively," Maroons coach Clayton Fisher said. "Emily Becker is the one we want (on the line), and we got her the ball twice under pressure in the last minute and she came up short, but she'll make them next time."

Becker led West with 12 points. Doza had a game-high 23 for Centralia.
